



From the Executive Director:

Executive Director Denny Hydrick resigned in November of 2021 to take a position in his home state of Mississippi. In January of 2022 I was asked by the Board of Trustees to assume responsibilities as the Interim Executive Director.

2021 was a year of ups and downs, a year of recovery from the effects of COVID. Restrictions were relaxed, infection rates were falling, and life was returning to a sense of normalcy. The number of people served across the ministry increased by 9% over the previous year. Referrals for maternity care services and residential care services finally began to pick up again. GraceHaven, our crisis pregnancy center in Mt Vernon, saw its first full year of operation, serving families in Jefferson, Franklin, and Hamilton counties. Our income exceeded our expenses and it was an excellent year for our investments.

Reflecting on the challenges and blessings of 2021, I am reminded of Psalm 71:20-21 which declares, "Though you have made me see troubles, many and bitter, you will restore my life again; from the depths of the earth you will again bring me up. You will increase my honor and comfort me once more."

We praise God for His watch care over us and His faithful provision through even the most difficult times. We also thank God for the faithful support of the churches and individuals who have made this ministry possible for over 100 years. Our commitment to you is to be good stewards and to be faithful to the mission.
